WHY SHOULD I GO TO BIBLE COLLEGE?

Romans 12:2 “*And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.*”

The phrase “be not conformed to this world” is referring to a molding process. The world is constantly trying to mold us into its image, calling evil good and good evil. The world says, “Premarital sex is okay. Abstinence is prudish. Homosexuality is a choice as well as the murder of the unborn. Anyone who speaks against homosexuality or abortion is narrow-minded and unloving.” These are examples of the conforming pressures of this world.

We either succumb to the pressures of the world's mold or are transformed by the renewing of our minds. We renew our minds through the washing of water by the word. It's with a renewed mind that we can experience the will of God at work in our lives.

Imagine two hands. One holds a rock. The other holds a marshmallow. Each hand squeezes. The rock is as unchangeable as God's Word in the renewed mind. The marshmallow contorts and is molded by every squeeze, every whim of the world. It all depends upon what is inside you.

In Daniel chapter 3 is the story of a huge image that Nebuchadnezzar made and demanded that everyone bow to it or be thrown into a fiery furnace. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, being Hebrews, refused to bow to the idol. They stood firm and declared in:

Daniel 3:17-18 “*our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.*”

Nothing Nebuchadnezzar could do affected the decision of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego to honor only their God. They had the right stuff inside them. As a result, they experienced a miracle of God's deliverance that changed a nation. And they were promoted, too.

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were prepared to fill their moment in history because their minds were not conformed to the Babylonian world. Their minds were renewed to the truths in God's Word.

You also have a moment in history. Your decision to go to Bible College can help you be prepared to fulfill it.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENTS

The Scriptures: We believe that all of Scripture (both the Old and New Testament) are verbally inspired by God and are our final authority in all matters pertaining to doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness (II Timothy 3:16, 17).

God: We believe in only one true God; One in essence, nature, and attributes, but existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (I John. 5:7).

Jesus Christ: We believe in the deity of the Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His shed blood on Calvary for the forgiveness of our sins, of His bodily resurrection and ascension to the Father's right hand. We do not believe that He is simply "a" way to the Father, but rather the "only" way through which we can receive righteousness, regeneration, sanctification, and glorification. He is, in fact, our salvation (I Corinthians 1:30-31).

Holy Spirit: We believe in the baptism with the Holy Spirit, expressed with speaking in tongues according to Acts 1:8; 2:4; 9:17; 10:44-46; 11:15-16 and 19:6. We believe this experience is distinct from, and subsequent to, the new birth, and can be received by faith (Galatians 3:2).

Salvation: We believe that all who, in repentance and faith, receive the Lord Jesus as Savior and Lord are born again (Acts 20:20-21; Romans 10:9-13).

Healing: We believe that the redemptive work of Christ on the cross has provided healing for the human body (Matthew 8:16, 17; Isaiah 53:4; I Peter 2:24).

The Resurrection: We believe in the resurrection of the just and the unjust; one to everlasting life and one to everlasting damnation (Matthew 25:46).

The Second Coming: We believe in a literal, physical second return of the Lord Jesus Christ (I Thessalonians 1:10; 4:16-17).

The Church: We believe that the universal church is comprised of all true believers who have received salvation through Christ (Ephesians 1:22-23). We also believe in and encourage fellowship with a local church (Hebrews 10:25).

Gifts of the Spirit: We believe that spiritual gifts and manifestations of the Holy Spirit are for the common good and building up of others today (I Corinthians. 12:7).

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

Charis Bible College has three basic standards by which students' progress is measured: grace, servanthood, and character. Detailed below are "guideposts" by which the working out of these truths may be measured, not a formula by which these qualities may be attained. As a believer we already possess everything we need in Christ, but must yield our souls and bodies so that these qualities are manifested in our thoughts and actions.

1. Grace: 2 Peter 1:2-3, "Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord, according as His divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him that hath called us to glory and virtue.

"Charis" is the Greek word for grace. The grace of God is God's favor given to every believer who by faith puts his or her trust in Jesus Christ. Grace is multiplied in your life as you relate with other people. The grace of God, His ability working in you, is manifested as you are willing to listen and understand the heart of your teachers and fellow students. You exercise forgiveness as you see the best in people and overlook human faults, enabling you to work with those you may disagree with.

2. Servanthood: As disciples of Jesus Christ, students at Charis Bible College value and walk in humility and servanthood. They are willing to put the needs of others ahead of their own desires, and find opportunities on their own to serve the school, staff, fellow students, and others.

3. Character: It is defined by the example of our Lord Jesus Christ and further explained by the writers of the Bible. This is measured by your attendance, faithfulness in paying tuition, obeying rules, and living by the highest moral and ethical standards.

CONDUCT

We expect all students of Charis Bible College to conduct themselves to the best of their abilities, in agreement with the teachings of Jesus, both on and off campus, at all times while enrolled as students.

DRESS CODE

Modesty and good taste are considered the principle guidelines for all students while on campus. Business-casual dress for men and women that is clean and neat is appropriate for classes and daily campus activities. Occasionally, circumstances may dictate a more formal dress. On such occasions, dresses for the ladies are appropriate. Suits, or sport coats with ties, are considered formal for men.
